Division of Vocational Rehab Services (DVR)*

The Division of Vocational Rehabilitation offers unique services to individuals with disabilities for the express purpose of assisting them in achieving an employment outcome. There are a wide range of disabilities that are covered by DVR in the categories of learning, cognitive, psychological, physical, and social.

DVR services may include:

- Medical, psychological, and vocational evaluations
- Medical and psychological treatment
- Help with expenses due to participation in rehabilitation
- Information and referral services
- Transition-to-work services for high school students with disabilities
- Supported employment for persons with severe disabilities
- Rehabilitation technology
- Vocational and other training
- Disability and employment assessment
- Occupational licenses, tools, and other equipment
- Assistance with small-business plan development
- Interpreter services
- Special modifications to vehicles
